Helping Verbs

Helping Verbs appear with action verbs in a sentence. They help to create a verb phrase.

Some helping verbs can be linking verbs if they are alone in a sentence.

HELPING VERBS:

IS	AM	ARE	WAS	WERE
BE	BEEN	BEING	DO	DOES
DID	HAS	HAVEHAD	CAN	
MAY	WILL	SHALL	COULD	WOULD
SHOULD	MIGHT	MUST		

Direct/Indirect Objects

ACTION VERBS SOMETIMES HAVE COMPLEMENTS CALLED DIRECT AND INDIRECT OBJECTS.

DIRECT OBJECTS--ASK WHO? WHAT? AFTER THE VERB

INDIRECT OBJECTS--ASK TO WHOM? FOR WHOM? TO WHAT? FOR WHAT?

***IF THE DIRECT/INDIRECT OBJECTS ARE PRONOUNS, YOU MUST USE **OBJECTIVE CASE**.
